

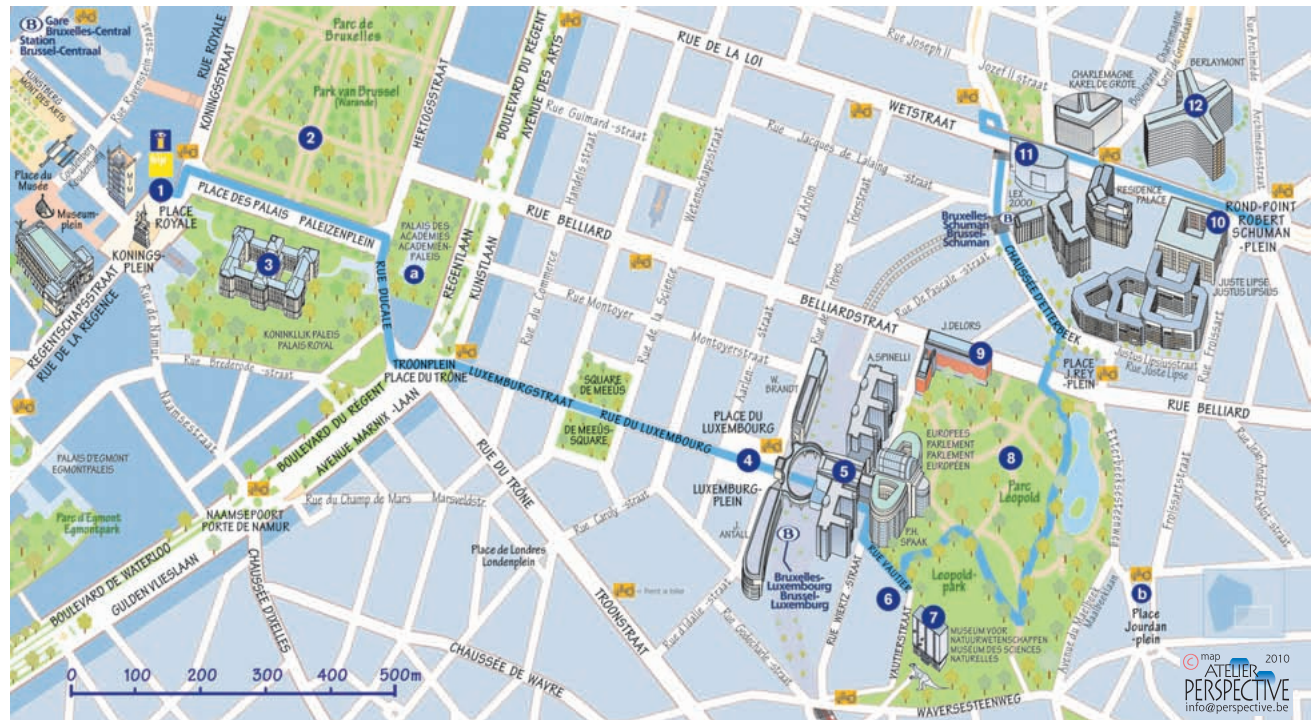

Tintin arrives in the train station

Right in the middle of the European district, at the entrance to Gare du Luxembourg (train station), the most famous reporter has carved out a place for himself, in black and white, on one of the walls adjacent to Place du Luxembourg. This fresco of Tintin, drawn in 1932, shows the arrival of Saint Nicholas in Brussels. It's worth noting that the railway station is one of the oldest in Europe and its façade is listed. For the most informed Tintinophiles, note that Gare du Midi is also adorned with another black and white panel taken from the album "Tintin in America".
